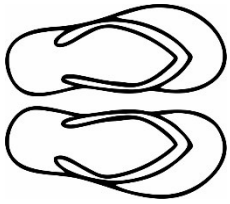

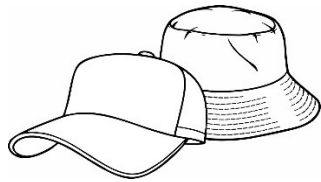
# BABANANGO Outdoor Education
