## ITINERARY FOR YOUR SCHOOL

We traditionally do three (3) activities per day. Two (2) in the morning and one (1) in the afternoon. Please feel free to contact us should require changes to the itinerary below.

### PLEASE NOTE

Whilst we will do everything, we can ensure that your Itinerary is carried out, unforeseen circumstances may require changes to be made. As a result, we reiterate that this is a proposed Itinerary.

### WELCOME! - DAY 1

DATE	Monday, 06 January 2025 - Arrival after 12h00 pm
1ST ACTIVITY	<b>MEET AND GREET</b> Facilitators will welcome the students & settle them into allocated tented campsites.
2ND ACTIVITY	<b>Obstacle Course (2 Hours)</b>
PLEASE NOTE	Considerable Activity Tours - involve extensive walking, including inclines, uneven terrain & steps. Please note: Physical Injuries due to uneven surfaces and the obstacle course may be possible.
DETAILS	Our obstacle course is fun, thought-provoking and challenging. Designed to test the strengths and weaknesses of both individuals and the group, activities are closely monitored by our staff when attempted.
3RD ACTIVITY	<b>EVENING HIKE (2 Hours)</b>
PLEASE NOTE	Involves some stairs and inclines. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes. Children are taken on a hike through the reserve.
DETAILS	A night walk as a group, looking for eyes reflecting from the bush. Solitaire: An opportunity to reflect in solitude, away from the hustle and bustle.

## DAY 2

DATE	Tuesday, 07 January 2025
1ST ACTIVITY	MINIATURE RAFT BUILDING (2 Hours)
PLEASE NOTE	Involves extensive walking, including inclines, uneven terrain & steps. Physical injuries may occur due to uneven surfaces and water activity. Children will be in the water at times. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.
DETAILS	Working in groups, students are expected to build a miniature raft. Using only natural materials, all rafts are subject to three challenges: the strength test, the speed test and the aesthetics test. A swim in the river is encouraged after the competition is over.
2ND ACTIVITY	TEAM CHALLENGE (2 hours)
PLEASE NOTE	Involves extensive walking, including inclines, uneven terrain & steps. Physical injuries may occur due to uneven surfaces. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.
DETAILS	A competitive six-point challenge, where teams compete against each other for point self-evaluation within the team contact concludes this activity. It is a great way for teamwork and to assess individual strengths and weaknesses.
3RD ACTIVITY	SENIOR MAP WORK GRADE 10,11 & 12 (2 hours)
PLEASE NOTE	Involves some stairs and inclines. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.
DETAILS	Using a sand relief model and 1:50 000 maps, we reinforced the basic theory of map work at camp. We then divide the students into groups and guide them in completing activities using their recently acquire map work skills.

## DAY 3

DATE	Wednesday, 08 January 2025
1ST ACTIVITY	OUT AND ABOUT ORIENTEERING (2 hours)
PLEASE NOTE	Involves extensive walking, including inclines, uneven terrain & steps. Physical injuries may occur due to uneven surfaces. Children will be taken on an orienteering walk through the reserve. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.

**DETAILS** After being divided into groups, students are prepared for a structured exploration of the property. This activity improves both map reading and orienteering skills, as students have to find various points on a map. Teamwork is also tested and improved during this activity.

**2ND ACTIVITY** **ORPHANAGE VISIT (2 hours)**

**PLEASE NOTE** Involves some stairs and inclines. This activity requires transport and wearing comfortable shoes.

**DETAILS** With prior arrangements, students are provided with the opportunity to visit a rural orphanage. There they learn about the orphanage, are shown the facilities and interact with its residents. Students are also encouraged to help the residents in some way, either with a gift of time or with donated goods.

**3RD ACTIVITY** **SOLITAIRE/ REFLECTION (2 Hours)**

**PLEASE NOTE** Involves some movements and creative thinking. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.

**DETAILS** An opportunity to reflect in solitude, away from the hustle and bustle

## **DAY 4**

**DATE** Thursday, 09 January 2025

**1ST ACTIVITY** **MODERN ZULU VILLAGE (5 Hours)**

**PLEASE NOTE** Involves some stairs and inclines. This activity requires transport and wearing comfortable shoes.

**DETAILS** With prior arrangements, students are given the opportunity to visit a modern Zulu village. Information is given about its history, current infrastructure and traditions is shared. Afterwards, students partake in daily life at the Modern Zulu Village.

**2ND ACTIVITY** **SCAVENGER HUNT (2 Hours)**

**PLEASE NOTE** Involves some stairs and inclines. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.

**DETAILS** A very good follow on from the eco-trail, students are presented with a checklist of items they are required to find. These items include a dung beetle, crabs, bones and porcupine quills. Students are then awarded points depending on what they have found in the allotted time.

## 3RD ACTIVITY THE NIGHT SKY (2 Hours)

**PLEASE NOTE** Involves some stairs, inclines, distances or other movements that call for more dexterity or exertion. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.

**DETAILS** An informative look at the night sky, including the stars in our solar system.

## DAY 5

**DATE** Friday, 10 January 2025

**1ST ACTIVITY ISANDLWANA & RORKE'S DRIFT (10 hours)**  
Full-day trip, departure time as early as possible

**PLEASE NOTE** Involves some stairs, inclines and distances. This activity requires transport and wearing comfortable shoes. Packed lunches and snacks are provided during the tour.

**DETAILS** During this 10-hour history tour, children will be hands-on, including role-playing and visual aids. From the lofty heights of the Nqutu Ridge, students enjoy a panoramic view of both the Isandlwana and Rorke's drift battlefield.

**2ND ACTIVITY CAMP CONCERT (2 Hours)**

**PLEASE NOTE** Involves some movements, team building and creative thinking. This activity requires wearing comfortable shoes.

**DETAILS** A selection of reverting performances based on a common theme. The teams compete to give the best performances (dancing, singing or acting). It's a fun interactive challenge

**DATE** Saturday, 11 January 2025 - Departure at 12h00 pm
